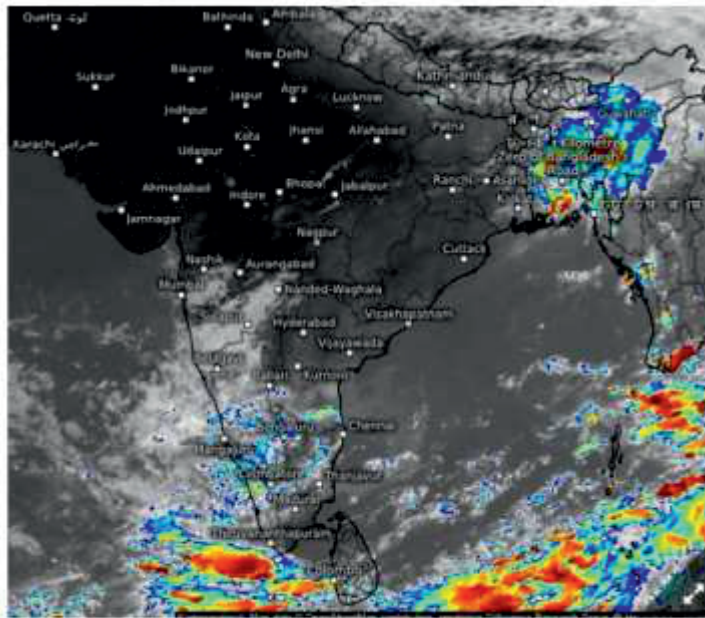


Asani causes loss of ₹2,500 cr in AP, agriculture bears brunt

Early onset of heat wave poses new challenges for India, notes UN ESCAP

Global consultancy RMSI has estimated that severe cyclone Asani, which hit Andhra Pradesh, may have caused a potential loss of ₹2,500 crore with a maximum impact on agriculture (₹2,000 crore).

Pushpendra Johari, Senior Vice President–Sustainability, RMSI, told BusinessLine that Asani brought heavy rain and strong winds, severely impacting crops such as mango, banana, turmeric and papaya on

thousands of acres in Kadapa, Kurnool, Prakasam, Krishna and West Godavari districts of Andhra Pradesh.
