# RMSI working with governments across the globe

Geospatial and engineering solutions company **RMSI** has been working with the **National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA)**, the Home Ministry and several State disaster management authorities to design disaster modelling solutions.

The company's solutions address global issues of climate change, natural calamities, human habitation, food security, autonomous transportation, smart utilities and networks.

"We have not just created geospatial dashboards, but we have created some kind of disaster modelling solutions," said Anup Jindal, CEO and Joint Managing Director. "We have a group of scientists who are able to model different natural phenomena and we are able to integrate that into a decision dashboard."

He went on to explain this with an example. He said that if there is a cyclone approaching, with RMSI's solution, one can plug in the MET department data of the cyclone path and see which are the communities and homes that are likely to get impacted so government agencies can plan.

"We also recently launched a flood forecasting system. Depending on the predicted rainfall, you can predict what kind of flooding could happen and what the responses could be. So these kinds of solutions are already there, and being used by various national and state level agencies, a lot of them funded by the **World Bank**," Jindal said.

He went on to add that RMSI boasts the largest share of Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) consultancy projects in the World Bank today.

While the company has a number of private players who use their services, the company works extensively with the government, not just in India but overseas too.

"We are working with two very important government agencies in the UK," he said. "One is related to land records and the other is similar to the Survey of India and is called the Ordnance Survey of Great Britain. It is one of the oldest mapping agencies in the world and is the national mapping agency of the UK and which we are involved with updating and maintaining the maps for Great Britain.

The other wins that the company has had recently relate to Australia where the government is looking to roll out what is called the **National Broadband Network** programme.

"Australia has this national programme in which they're rolling out the broadband network across the country, which is funded by the government. This means this is one of the largest broadband rollouts and we have had multiple wins with contractors who have been tasked to implement this network. So we will design the high speed broadband networks for these companies," he said.
